## **Metro Vancouver Housing meeting**

In February 2025, two of our executive team members proudly presented Food Link Society's work at the Metro Vancouver Housing Committee Meeting highlighting a partnership that has been growing strong since 2018. Through this collaboration, Food Link Society now provides free, recovered food to residents in 25 Metro Vancouver Housing (MVH) sites across the Tri-Cities, Surrey, North Vancouver, Vancouver, Maple Ridge, and Richmond. 352 families, including 588 adults and 297 children benefits from the program.

This program has been especially meaningful for vulnerable seniors and individuals with disabilities, who benefit from receiving food right in the comfort of their building's community or party rooms.



## Coquitlam's first community kitchen
